# Will there still be specialists?

Art, music, library/ Information
Technology (IT), and guidance
lessons will be taught to students
within their classroom. Delivering
these lessons in the regular
classroom will allow students to remain in their
grade level group. As 1:1 technology becomes
more available after the arrival of new
Chromebooks in the district, the focus of the
library's IT curriculum will be to instruct students
on using district learning platforms and
technology.

# Will students be able to spend more time outside?

Each classroom teacher and specialist will have the opportunity to utilize identified outdoor learning spaces for instruction and movement breaks.

# Will my child have access to electronic devices to use?

Eventually all K-5 students will be assigned to their own device to use during the school day. In preparation for any possible school closures, students in K-2 will be learning to use Seesaw and students in grade 3-5 will use Google Classroom as their learning management system.

#### Will children need to wear a mask all day?

Face coverings will be required at all times except during eating, outdoor recess/phy ed, and supervised outside classroom movement breaks.



## Who is allowed to visit the school?

There will be more restrictions on visitors and volunteers to the schools this year. Any requests to visit school must be pre-approved by the building principal.




## What if my child gets hurt or sick at school?



Classroom teachers will have their own Band-Aids and commonly needed supplies in their classrooms. We are working closely with our district nurse and Dunn County Health Nurse with procedures for symptom screening. Students presenting symptoms of being

ill will be sent to the office to be evaluated. Please make sure emergency contacts are up to date, as the timely pick up of students meeting the criteria of COVID symptoms is essential to reduce the spread of illness in school.



Students will be taught the new routines and expectations for proper handwashing, mask use, physical distancing, and classroom clean up. Playground routines and expectations will be taught to allow students to participate in recess and other movement breaks without masks while maintaining reasonable physical distancing.
